As an early childhood educator, you will be challenged to find new experiences to share with children. Basics in Child Care will guide educators through six fundamental areas of early childhood development to prepare them for caring for children, to be knowledgeable of child development, resourceful in planning activities, skilled in guiding behavior, and able to maintain healthy environments.

On June 17, 2024, Alabama Pathways, also known as the Professional Development Registry (PDR) website went back online. All licensed facilities MUST register for classes through Alabama Pathways. Any certificates obtained from June 1, 2023 to now MUST be uploaded to Alabama Pathways. Child Care Central will no longer give printed certificates for trainings to licensed facilities. Certificates will be available on the PDR within 48 business hours of the training date.
