## INTRODUCING

### *“Naptime Nuggets: Professional Learning in Bite-Size Sessions”*

## Training sessions offered this quarter:

### ***APT: Rhythm and Rhymes***

Training Level: Basic; DHR Training Areas: CD, LD

Let's talk about how we can create early language experiences using music, nursery rhymes and simple songs. We will learn the importance of using language each day for a foundation of learning success and explore free PBS resources to use in the classroom and to share with families.

### ***APT Distance Learning: Right From Birth***

Training Level: Intermediate; Target Age Group: Infants & Toddlers

Right From Birth is designed for parents and child care professionals serving children from birth to eighteen months. ### ***What are You Doing and What Do I Do with That?***

Do you know what your infants and toddlers should be able to do and by when? How do you keep up with what they know and use it to prepare lesson plans to give them the experiences they are missing? This class will focus on identifying infant and toddler physical developmental milestones and showing you different methods of recording what you learn. You will also learn how to use these observation tools to create individual plans to meet the developmental needs of your children.

### ***Talk to me, Baby!***

In this training, we will be discussing how infants and toddlers learn language skills and ways we can help them in the classroom with these skills through games and activities.

### ***Different Leadership Styles: What is My Style?***

What type of leader are you? How can you strengthen your leadership practices? Why doesn't this one leadership style work for you? In this training, we will explore these questions, and many others, through discussions and demonstrations.

### ***How Can I Help You?***

As a director, it can be hard to understand each of the teacher's personalities, needs, wants and desires for their classroom. This training will help you to be able to lead teachers in coming together in unity for a common purpose.

### ***What Do You Mean?***

Do you ever feel like your staff does not hear you or understand what you are trying to get across to them? Come learn effective ways that you can communicate with your staff to increase productivity and morale in your childcare center.

5. Children under the age of 16 are not allowed to attend or stay for training sessions, including on-site training sessions.
6. CCC training is open to all persons regardless of race, national origin, religion, age, sex, political beliefs, or disability.

## **\*Important Update Regarding Alabama Pathways**

**On June 17, 2024, Alabama Pathways, also known as the Professional Development Registry (PDR) website went back online. All licensed facilities MUST register for classes through Alabama Pathways. Any certificates obtained from June 1, 2023 to now MUST be uploaded to Alabama Pathways. Child Care Central will no longer give printed certificates for trainings to licensed facilities. Certificates will be available on the PDR within 48 business hours of the training date.**
